BOMB THREAT

Upon receipt of a bomb threat, it is impossible to know if it is real or a hoax. Therefore, precautions need to be taken for the safety of residents and employees.

Procedure: If a bomb threat is received over the phone, at the office or in a patient's home, follow these procedures:

- Keep the caller on the line as long as possible.
- 2. Ask the caller to repeat the message.
- 3. Ask the caller his/her name.
- 4. Ask the caller where the bomb is located.
- 5. Document as much of the conversation as possible
- 6. Record time call was received and terminated.
- 7. Inform the caller that the building is occupied and the detonation of a bomb could result in death or serious injury to many innocent people.

If possible, during the call:

- 1. Call 911.
- 2. Call the Administrator on Call, if not present.
- 3. Follow the orders of police or emergency personnel to facilitate staff/patient evacuation.

Once the police have arrived:

- Have all keys available so that police can enter and inspect all rooms, desks, file cabinets and storage areas.
- If a suspected bomb is located within the building/home, the responsibility for investigation will be that of the law enforcement officials.
