- Hospice is a philosophy of care for patients whose illness is no longer responding to curative treatment
- Hospice treats the individual and family as a unit; collaborating with them on the development of a plan of care that meets the goals and wishes of the patient

Hospice encourages the patient and family to be involved in the decision-making process and affirms their roles as drivers of the Plan of Care

Hospice can be provided in:

- Patient's home or family member's home
- Nursing home
- Hospital
- Assisted living facility

- Hospice believes that death is an integral part of the life cycle and that end of life care should focus on pain relief, comfort and enhanced quality of life
- Hospice recognizes the potential for growth that often exists within the dying experience for the individual and his/her family and seeks to protect and nurture this potential

- The Hospice philosophy utilizes a holistic interdisciplinary approach to end-of-life that offers physical, social, spiritual and emotional care to the patient and caregiver
- The interdisciplinary team is the "heart of hospice"
