ITEM INTENT
<p>Identifies existence of condition(s) <u>prior to</u> medical regimen change or inpatient stay within past 14 days. This information is important for care planning and setting goals.</p>

RESPONSE—SPECIFIC INSTRUCTIONS
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Select Response 7 – None of the above – if the patient experienced an inpatient facility discharge or change in medical or treatment regimen within the past 14 days, and none of the indicated conditions existed <u>prior to</u> the inpatient stay or change in medical or treatment regimen. Select Response “NA” if no inpatient facility discharge <u>and</u> no change in medical or treatment regimen in past 14 days. Note that both situations must be true for this response to be marked “NA.” Select Response “Unknown” if the patient experienced an inpatient facility discharge or change in medical or treatment regimen within the past 14 days, and it is unknown whether the indicated conditions existed <u>prior to</u> the inpatient stay or change in medical or treatment regimen. The term “past fourteen days” is the two-week period immediately preceding the start/resumption of care. This means that for purposes of counting the 14-day period, the date of admission is day 0 and the day immediately prior to the date of admission is day 1.
